October	Informational – Texts that provide information about a variety of topics (animals, sports, history, weather, space, etc.)	Wednesday 10/26/16

December	Realistic Fiction – A story using made characters that could happen in real life.	Friday 12/16/16
January	Science Fiction – A type of fantasy that uses science and technology (robots, time machines, etc.) or Fantasy – A story including elements that are impossible such as talking animals or magical powers. Make-believe is what this genre is all about.	Wednesday 1/25/17
February	Autobiography or Biography – A story of a real person's life that is either written by the person or another person.	Wednesday 2/22/17

Here's what you will do:

- 1. READING: Read the Book throughout the month.
- 2. WRITING: Write a description of the following:
 - a. Setting
 - b. Characters
 - c. Problem/Plot
 - d. Events
 - e. Solution/Moral
- 3. RATING: Rate the book Why did you like or dislike it?
- 4. PRESENTING: Present the book to the class in any way you like. Please get your idea approved before hand.

Here are some suggestions

- Create a neatly labeled timeline that chronicles at least 8 of the important events of your book.
- Create a newspaper article that grabs your readers' attention and summarizes what your book is about.
- Create a brochure about your book. Be sure to include all the story elements.
- Imagine your book is going to be made into a motion picture. Create a "trailer" or preview for the movie to encourage people to come see it.

- Create a diorama of your favorite scene in the book.
- Create an animated storyboard (comic strip without humor, unless you are reading a humorous book) summarizing your book.
- Dress up as the person in your book, tell who you are, what made you famous, and at least 5 significant facts or events from your life.
- Create a collage from magazine pictures, photos or clip art that illustrates your book.
- Create a pop-up book featuring the story elements.
- Write a brief sequel to your book. Be sure to include what happened in your book before you move into your book.
- Character Life Box (Collect props to display in a box)
- Make a CD/ Soundtrack for a movie version of your book with an explanation for each song choice
- Power Point presentation
- Design a room that a character would have
- Design a new book cover and explain why this should be the new cover
- Turn the book into a short play
- Design a movie poster
- Write a letter to the head of a production/movie company asking him/her to make the book into a movie
- Rewrite the story with a new setting
- Write a new beginning or ending to the story
